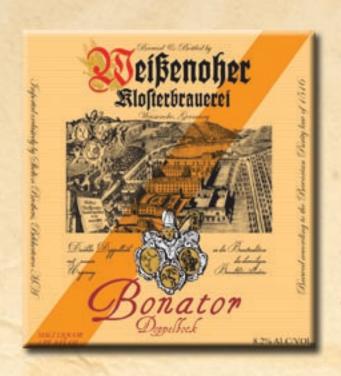

Legend has it that Doppel Bock was first made by monks as a hearty, full-bodied drink to be consumed in the tough fasting period. This 'Bonator' is named for Bonifatius, a missionary who came to the monastery long after brewing began in 1050 A.D..

At Weissenohe, the Reinheitsgebot (the Bavarian beer purity law) is still observed by owner Urban Winkler, His beer is made by the traditional, and painstaking, double-decoction method, passed down to him by earlier generations of brewmasters at Weissenohe and rarely observed in Bavaria today.

No one knows why all Doppel Bocks have names with the suffix '-ator'.
